

What is "Bullying?"

- "A rose by any other name would smell as sweet" - Shakespeare
 - Aggression
 - Incivility
 - Horizontal or lateral violence
 - Intimidation
 - Mobbing
 - Others?



International Labour Organization

"[O]ffensive behaviour through vindictive, cruel, malicious, or humiliating attempts to undermine an individual or group of employees"

(International Labour Organization, 1998)



Risk Factors

- Staffing patterns
- Stress, tension, and frustrations
- Lack of training to recognize or cope with bullying
- Shift work and demanding workloads
- Lack of reporting system or punishment against perpetrators
- Working alone
- Poor management skills and policies (International Council of Nurses, 2006)



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Effects of Bullying

- Increase in sick leave
- Resignations
- Personal health effects
- Decreased morale
- Increased staff turnover
- Understaffing



Ethical Considerations


- Principles of Biomedical Ethics
 - Nonmaleficence
 - Beneficence
 - Justice
- Virtues of a Moral Character
 - Compassion
 - Discernment
 - Integrity
 - Conscience



- Professional Codes of Ethics
 - ICN Code of Ethics for Nurses
 - "the nurse sustains a cooperative relationship with coworkers in nursing and other fields"
 - "the nurse takes appropriate action to safeguard individuals, families, and communities when their health is endangered by a coworker or any other person"



- ANA Code of Ethics for Nurses
 - Provision 1: Attitudes and behaviors
 - Provision 6: Workplace environment





Legal Considerations

- Bullying legislation
 - Australia: Brodie's Law
 - U.S.: 16 bills in 11 states
- OSHA's General Duty Clause
- Anti-harassment statutes
- Anti-defamation statutes
